Department of Health Research Subhramanyam,

In order to reduce the diagnostic time in various viral diseases e.g. H1N1, incluenza, swine flu etc. and to put in place an early warning system for various viral epidemics, the Union Cabinet has approved a Centrally Sponsored Plan scheme on 27th June 2013 for establishing a network of regional, state and local Viral Research and Diagnostic Laboratories (VRDLs) across the country.

- 2. The Government of India will set up over 160 viral research and diagnostic laboratories across the country in this Scheme. Under the Scheme 9 VRDLs (one State Level and eight medical College Level) are to be established in your State. Once these laboratories will be functional, it is expected that any viral epidemic occurring in your State will be diagnosed quickly to improve the public health response to these viral diseases/epidemics.
- 3. The performance of this scheme with respect of Andhra Pradesh was reviewed and it was revealed that two locations have already been finalised for medical college level laboratories. The preparatory work at the other 7 VRDLs (one State Level and six medical college level) locations are yet to be finalised. Also, various administrative issues were found needing attention pertaining particularly to the procurement of the equipment, renovation/construction of buildings and other miscellaneous preparatory works. I am also attaching a list of such administrative issues pertaining Andhra Pradesh needing urgent attention.
- 4. Although most of the Viral Research & Diagnostic Laboratories are being established in the Medical Colleges and the involvement of Medical College administration has been encouraging, however, it is felt that involvement of the State Medical Education Department would help in accelerating the pace of the implementation of this scheme.
- 5. We are also planning a review of this schemes pertaining to Andhra Pradesh in near future and I would request for the time, date and venue of the review meeting shortly. Meanwhile, the issues identified may please be got addressed and a nodal officer from the state government to please be nominated for this scheme, with his full communication details. As such proactive involvement of the Medical Education Department of the State Government is solicited.

	State Level	1. The locations for the State Level VRDL is yet to be identified in the absence of any suggestions, proposals from the State Government. State Government is requested to come up with proposal at the earliest, preferably within 3 months so that the funds could be tied up.
	Medical College Level Sri Venketswara Institute of Medical Sciences, Tirupati and Siddhartha Medical College, Vijaywada	 A total budget of Rs. 2, 60, 00,000/- were released by DHR, in October 2014, for establishment of two Medical College level VRDLs at Sri Venketswara Institute of Medical Sciences, Tirupati and Siddhartha Medical College, Vijaywada (1.3 cr for each Medical College level VRDL: 0.7 cr for equipment; 0.37 cr for renovation/civil work of the lab and 0.23 cr as recurring budget for staff and consumables). Both the medical colleges are requested to take the following actions immediately: a. Furnish details of allocated space for the lab. b. Expedite the procurement of equipment c. Complete the civil/renovation work d. Furnish the utilisation certification in respect of the funds utilised. e. Make the laboratory functional within 3 months.
		3. The State also needs to submit 7 more proposals and MoA to DHR for establishment of one State Level and six Medical College Level to achieve the target.
		4. Process of Procurement of Equipment and renovation/ construction of premises for laboratories, etc., may please be expedited, if necessary administrative approvals/ enhancement of financial powers of HOD/ Director of the medical college may be considered.
