CALL FOR RESEARCH PROPOSALS UNDER "GRANT-IN-AID (GIA) SCHEME FOR INTER-SECTORAL CONVERGENCE AND COORDINATION FOR PROMOTION AND GUIDANCE ON HEALTH RESEARCH" FOR THE YEAR 2021- 22

'Grant-in-Aid (GIA) Scheme for Inter-Sectoral Convergence and Coordination for Promotion and Guidance on Health Research' is a flagship programme of Department of Health Research, Ministry of Health and Family Welfare, Government of India. During the year 2021-22, Department of Health Research invites multicentric "Full Length Research Proposals" throughonline mode in area of "Randomized Controlled Trials" for the development/ evaluation of newer drugs, repurposed drugs, vaccines, technology, diagnostic algorithms, treatment protocols, socio-behavioral interventions, complex interventions, health system evaluation etc.

- 2. The research domains and themes should be in line with the National Health Policy 2017, SDG2030 goals of India and the findings of the Global Burden of Disease reports.
- 3. Interventions around any part of the spectrum of prevention, promotion, cure & rehabilitation of health problems are encouraged.
- 4. Randomized Controlled Trials (RCTs) should have the following characteristics to be considered for grant:
 - a) Late phase RCT
 - b) Any intervention including but not restricted to new/repurposed drugs, devices, sociobehavioural intervention etc.
 - c) Can be hospital-based or community trials.
 - d) Maximum of 3 years, preferably short-term ones.
 - e) Multicentric with the involvement of minimum 5 centres (can be relaxed for exceptionally good proposals)
 - f) The principal investigator having prior experience of conducting multi-centric RCTs
 - g) IEC should be CDSCO registered.

5. Duration, Type and Budget range of the proposals:

- Muticentric/Network proposal: With One Study Coordinator and Multiple Site Principal Investigators/Co-Investigators with PAN nature,
- **Budget Range**[#]: Rs.50 lakh -Rs.10 crore each.
- Duration: 1-3 years

[#]PI is suggested to estimate legitimate cost of the study as per research design/ work plan avoiding over-estimation / hypothetical budgeting. Costing of each budgetary component should clearly be spelt out.

6. Instructions for proposal submission:

- I. The full length research proposals may be submitted online on https://dhrschemes.icmr.org.in only and no proposal in physical/hard copy is to be submitted.

- V. PI should ensure that the proposed research and budget are in compliance with the eligibility criteria and instructions provided. Applications that do not meet the eligibility criteria and/or do not directly respond to the call area will not be reviewed, regardless of their quality.
