MONTHLY SUMMARY FOR THE CABINET FOR THE MONTH OF JUNE, 2018

An update on the principal activities and key initiatives undertaken by the Department of Health Research (DHR) during the month of June, 2018 is indicated below:

Important policy decisions taken and major achievements during the month:

- (a) Released 'The Nutrify India Now' Mobile App, the first app of its kind that provides data on raw foods and recipes with their nutrient composition and aids in assessing nutritional status, required dietary allowance (RDA), daily food intake and energy expenditure for users in as many as 17 Indian languages.
- (b) Nipah outbreak in Kerala: Provided support to monoclonal antibody storage and administration in relation to Nipah Virus Research to Government Medical College, Kozhikode, Kerala.
- (c) Nipah cases in Karnataka: NIV-Bangalore coordinated with Karnataka State Rapid Task Force (STRF) team for the collection and transport of clinical samples from suspected cases of Nipah to NIV Pune for laboratory identification.
- (d) NABL recommendation for accreditation of bacteriology lab of NIRT, Chennai and BSL-4 facility to Avian Influenza and Human Influenza groups of NIV, Pune.
- (e) Published 40 research papers in good impact journals in the areas of tuberculosis, HIV, cervical cancer, rota viruses, bacterial meningitis, malaria, Nipah virus, Chikungunya, type-2, diabetes, lymphatic filariasis, smokeless tobacco, etc.
- (f) Undertaken 21 major research projects in the areas of HIV, AES in Gorakhpur, Nipah virus, under-nutrition & hidden hunger, and Urban air quality assessment using remote sensing and GIS, etc.
- (g) Conducted a total of 19 training programs and courses for clinical faculties, medical microbiologists, post graduate doctors, research scientists, medical undergraduates, research assistants, laboratoty technologists, air force health staff and community health volunteers etc. in various areas of health research.
- (h) Celebrated 4th 'International Yoga Day' through a week-long Yoga program with the theme of Diabetes, stress and Yoga with demonstration of Asthangyoga and Mudras, Yoga for Diabetes, Cardiovascular Diseases, Stress and Yoga at Delhi, Mumbai, Kolkata, Dibrugarh and Bhubaneswar, 21st June, 2018.
